

What's in my bug out bag/get home bag



My Maxpedition Pygmy Falcon 2 with a Camelbak Max Gear bottle pouch, and summer sleeping bag attached.

First aid kit

Toiletry kit

Fire making kit

Fishing kit

1 Mountain House meal

2 Top Ramen noodles

1 package of Trader Joe's Organic beef jerky

1 (homemade, food saver sealed) package of oatmeal with raisins

1 small (homemade food saver sealed) package of rice

1 Mainstay food ration bar

1 small container of salt

1 small container of sugar

2 cloth tea bags

6 mini (bite size) milkyway bars. (Gotta have at least 1 comfort food, especially chocolate! :))

1 32 oz Nalgene water bottle

1 750ml Toaks Titanium cup/pot with lid and a homemade hanger.

1 (homemade) Silnylon tarp

2 pairs of underwear and socks

1 fixed blade knife (Morakniv Bushcraft Carbon Black Tactical Knife with 0.125/4.3-Inch Carbon Steel Blade) in a custom Kydex sheath with a ferro rod attached.

1 folding knife (Buck Alpha hunter)

1 multitool (Gerber)

3 bandana's

1 neck buff

1 small radio

8 spare batteries

1 Headlamp

1 compass with signal mirror
Cordage: 100 ft of 750 paracord, 50ft of 81' Catahoula Manufacturing #60 Tarred Braided Nylon Twine (Bank Line) 500 lb Tensile Strength. About 20ft of jute twine.
1 pair of leather gloves
1 Bahco laplander folding saw
1 mini Sawyer filter straw with kit
1 Fozzils Solo dish
1 small (60ml) container of Castile liquid soap.
1 small (60ml) container of liquid Bleach
1 long handled titanium spoon
1 spork
1 Esbit stove with fuel tablets
1 Emberlit Stainless Steel stove
1 Genuine GI 4 color camouflage Camo Face paint kit
1 Buck edge tek ultra flip stick pro tri grit diamond knife sharpener
1 Smith diamond retractable knife sharpener
1 pair of reading glasses and 1 Survival shield sunglasses
20 Elife Aluiminum tent stakes
3 Grisly gear emergency blankets
1 Sillcock key
40 EZ towels
Ear plugs
1 EMS rain poncho
1 sleeping bag (that I attach to the outside of my back pack), that's in a Sea to Summit waterproof compression sack.)
1 Schrade 15 inch hatchet

I also bought 1 BuckleGear Backpack waist strap, and attached that to my bag so I would have a wastrap. Works awesome!

Another modification I did was to buy a longer strap for the backpack, that I used to replace the short one that was on there. You can see it in the picture, where it's wrapped around the sleeping bag. I can lengthen it or shorten the strap depending on what I want it to hold onto the backpack.

I also have a Buck Punk knife in a custom kydex sheath with the ferro rod attached, that I will wear on my belt.

Altogether the weight of this very full backpack is 14lbs to 18lbs with the full water bottle. The weight depends on which sleeping bag I have attached and rain gear and or large heavy down coat.
